

Pediatrics – 6 weeks

During the 8 week Pediatric Clerkship the students will be expected to spend three weeks on a pediatric hospital ward rotation (inpatient) and three weeks in an ambulatory (outpatient) setting, both under the direct supervision of a pediatrician. The following clinical conditions will be expected to be seen by the students and they will be expected to analyze these conditions using the schemes and process worksheets studied in Phase A. Participation in the patient's history, physical exam, differential diagnosis and therapeutic plan will be expected for the core clinical conditions listed:

- Chronic medical conditions
- Central nervous system
- Child abuse
- Dermatologic conditions
