Description:

Assistant/Associate/Full Professor level, Regional Clerkship Director with responsibility localized within a large healthcare system located in Southern California

Effort:

Up to 0.5 FTE, to accommodate the candidate's practice

Position reports to: The Senior Chair of the Clinical Sciences Department

Responsibilities:

- Design and implement the respective clerkship - organization, content and mode of delivery for all clerkship-related activities in a community-based educational model, in accordance with institutional, accreditation and discipline specific requirements
- Design a vertically- and horizontally-integrated clerkship format and content, framed within the clinical context of an integrated curriculum
- Manage the delivery of the curriculum, based on direction from the Curriculum Committee and Associate/Assistant Dean(s) of Curriculum, including the general competencies and educational program objectives to be taught and learned in the respective clerkship, the length of the clerkship, the content, and the methods of teaching and assessment
- As a content expert, submit annual proposals and recommendations to the Curriculum Committee for needed improvements in clerkship-specific objectives, format, content, methods of teaching and student assessment
- Design/deliver outstanding student experience, attending to all curriculum matters, as well as maintaining a learning environment that promotes mutual respect and professional behavior on the part of faculty, staff and students
- Provide course schedules, syllabi, and information for educational database
- Choose/change faculty who teach students as appropriate, provide faculty with development opportunities and feedback on their teaching
- Monitor student assessment and provide timely feedback and assignment of grades
- Communicate with site directors at various clinical sites and report to the Curriculum Committee on the uniform delivery of the curriculum and the educational experiences of all students at all sites
- Support student remediation planning and activities
- Serve as a **College Master** (student mentor, academic advisor and role model), and supervise the academic progress of an assigned group of students throughout their medical program
- Support the delivery of the Masters Colloquium and Medical Skills courses for pre-clerkship students
- Support student career advising and student medical specialty interest groups
- Participate in scholarship activities
- Participate in faculty development programs

- Serve on departmental and institutional committees
- Provide clinical service (negotiable)

Qualifications:

- Terminal degree (MD, MD/PhD) with Board Certification
- Licensure in the State of California
- Prior experience serving as a clerkship director is highly desired
- Documented accomplishments as a clinician and clinician-educator
- Experience and documented accomplishments in teaching medical students
- Ability to work effectively in an inter-disciplinary environment

Preferences:

- Applicants with experience in teaching in an integrated curriculum will be preferred

Qualities:

- Exceptional interpersonal communication skills
- Abilities to lead collaborative inter-organizational programs
- Knowledge about design of adult learning and active learning educational experiences
- Commitment to professional excellence and innovation in medical education

Highlights:

California Northstate University College of Medicine (CNUCOM) is a new allopathic medical education program approved by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC) and preliminary accredited by the Liaison Committee on Medical Education (LCME). The curriculum uses a horizontally- and vertically-integrated interdisciplinary clinical presentation approach. Clinical presentations (patients' chief complaints) are the framework within which basic and clinical science knowledge will be built. Integrated curriculum introduces the students to basic and clinical sciences for the first two years. In the third and fourth years, a community-based, clinical training model is being adopted.

Applications will be reviewed upon receipt. For full consideration, candidates should provide curriculum vitae with at least three references. All candidates are asked to provide a cover letter, articulating how their knowledge, experience, and beliefs have prepared them to function in support of California Northstate University's vision and mission statements.
