

Reproductive System

The Male and Female reproductive system consists of the testicles, the duct system [male – epididymis and the vas deferens], the accessory glands [seminal vesicles and prostate gland] and the penis [shaft and gland]. Unlike the Male, the Female reproductive system is located entirely in the pelvis. The vulva [= covering] opens to the vagina and the other reproductive organs located inside the body. Mons pubis is located above the vaginal opening. The clitoris is a small sensory organ located in front of the vulva. Between the labia is the Urethra. The internal organs are the vagina, cervix, uterus, fallopian tubes and ovaries. The Hymen partially covers the opening of the vagina. The female reproductive system enables the Woman to produce eggs, have sexual intercourse, protects the fertilized egg and give birth. The baby girl is born hundreds of thousands of eggs which are inactive until puberty begins.
