




#### Research Day


#### **Volunteering Efforts**

#### **MOU WITH BRAZILIAN UNIVERSITY**

In June, an MOU was signed between Universidade de Mogi das Cruzes (UMC), Sao Paulo, Brazil, and California Northstate University (CNSU). This collaboration aims to strengthen cooperation in medicine and biomedical science, including scholar and learner exchanges. Researchers from both institutions, including Dr. Goroso, Dr. Robson (UMC), and Dr. Puglisi (CNSU), have already collaborated on publications and presentations. Their current projects focus on Postural Orthostatic Tachycardia Syndrome (POTS) in long COVID patients and developing a new mathematical model for the cardiovascular system. This partnership reflects a shared commitment to advancing medical research and education.




#### THE MOBILE OR






#### FACULTY HIGHLIGHTS
